You will be taught by lecturers who specialize in Eastern Europe, from Ludwig-Maximilians-Universität in Munich and from the University of Regensburg.

In the graduate program, Eastern Europe is not regarded as a closed space, but seen in relation to Western Europe and other major regions. The course explores the historic variability of the term "Eastern Europe". The curriculum takes an interdisciplinary approach.

The lectures make reference to various countries in Fastern Europe, often comparing them with each other. However, comparisons are also drawn between developments and situations in Western Europe and Eastern Europe.
