The Chair of Cultural Heritage and Preservation (Juniorprofessur Sicherung Kulturellen Erbes) at the Faculty of Architecture is looking for

Two research associates (PhD positions)

to work in the joint research project "Cities Building Culture - Heritage in post-Soviet urban development". The positions are fixed term posts for 3 years from the start date of April 1, 2021 with the option of another 3 years extension. They are part-time posts (50%, TVL 13) and subject to the final funding approval.

The opportunity:

The joint research project "Cities Building Culture- aims at developing new approaches to the sustainable enhancement of the architectural heritage in the post-Soviet cities. Therefore, it build on fundamental research and international and interdisciplinary dialogue. In four sub-projects, the research network looks at different cities in Russia at the intersection of cultural, historical, social, planning and environmental sciences. Using the example of selected city quarters from the pre-socialist and socialist eras of the late 19th and 20th centuries, the joint research project examines, which past- and present-related values are attributed to the variously endangered urban neighbourhoods. Approaches of monument preservation and urban planning as well as civil engagement are questioned with regard to their effectiveness in terms of sustainable, cautious development. The joint research project promotes the post-Soviet regional studies and strengthens the interdisciplinary field of urban heritage preservation and development. It aims at the promotion of young scholars in particular. Given this project context, we are looking for:

- one research associate (PhD position) to work in the subproject "Institutional Practices": The project investigates the institutional settings, practices and local impacts of state monument preservation and urban planning in Russian sample cities with regard to the promotion of an urban development, which is cautious towards the cultural, socio-material fabric of urban neighourhoods.
- one research associate (PhD position) to work in the subproject "Civil Practices": The project researches the emergence and conditions, the practices and effects of civil engagement and urban activism for the preservation and enhancement of built heritage in Russian cities.
